Change of Art

A record 22 satellite fairs nearly eclipsed Art Basel Miami Beach last year. But have any of them been claimed by the downtrodden economy? We checked in with some of last year's participants to see whether they'll be in town at the same time as ABMB's eighth edition, which runs December 3-6. —*Cesly Burgess*



The five-year-old **Pulse Miami** keeps its cool as it moves to Downtown's Ice Palace in order to enjoy more space and easier causeway access. >> **Art Asia** returns with a new intention: to give younger galleries the chance to debut on an international level. It will still host Asian galleries that were so popular last year. >> **NADA** leaves the mainland for a spot at the Deauville Beach Resort. The fair, which will be in the hotel's Napoleon and Richelieu ballrooms, will be divided in two sections: one exclusively for solo presentations and "Unrestricted Booths," where exhibitors can show as many artists as they choose. >> **Aqua**

Art Miami will no longer be based in part at the Aqua Hotel. This year, it'll focus on the new Aqua Wynwood project and consolidate both fairs into a single intimate, booth-style setting. >> For art lovers with sea legs, **Sea Fair** was a must last year. But this year, they're jumping ship at Basel-time and instead returning as part of a land-based fair at the Miami Beach Convention Center January 7-10. >> Back for its 20th edition, **Art Miami** recently renewed its contract with the Arts District, agreeing to three more years in the Midtown Miami venue. >> Other fairs have yet to confirm, but check back next issue for updates.
